FAA GIVES NOD TO AMCC

March 13, 2006 – The FAA today recognized a proposed training program titled "Elements of an Aviators' Model Code of Conduct" as an acceptable industry conducted recurrent training program. Such programs, identified in FAA Advisory Circular 61-91H, Pilot Proficiency Awards Program, are widely known as "WINGS" and "SEAWINGS."

This seminar will advance flight safety by improving judgment, honing aeronautical decision-making skills, and encouraging an ethical approach to flying. GA pilots will gain experience in real-world application of the *Aviators' Model Code of Conduct's* (AMCC) principles by a nationally recognized aviation faculty, led by Professors Dale DeRemer, Ph.D. and Bill Rhodes, Ph.D. Dr. Rhodes and the AMCC Permanent Editorial Board (see below) will provide oversight of the training program. The case-based seminar uses diverse resources, including the *Aviators' Model Code of Conduct* (AMCC) and supporting materials available on the <u>SecureAv</u> website.

The AMCC is a "living document," periodically updated to reflect changes in aviation practices and the aviation environment. It is available to the aviation community without charge.
