VENEZUELAN AVIATORS' MODEL CODE OF CONDUCT LAUNCHED

Caracas, May 2005 – The Modelo De Código de Conducta para Aviadores (MCCA), a Venezuelan translation of the Aviators' Model Code of Conduct (AMCC), has been launched as a voluntary, recommended practice guide for general aviation pilots with the goal of advancing flight safety, airmanship and the Venezuelan general aviation community. This is the first Spanish-language translation of the AMCC.

The MCCA translation was prepared by Tony Malvárez, of Caracas, Venezuela. Malvárez works as Information Systems Manager for the Venezuelan Bell Helicopters Representative (Aerotecnica, S.A.) at SVCS Airport (Aeropuerto de Caracas - Oscar Machado Zuloaga).

"This translation was undertaken with the Venezuelan Civil Aviation Community in mind," says Malvárez. "The Venezuelan equivalent of the FAA is the year-old Instituto Nacional de Aviación Civil (INAC) [National Institute of Civil Aviation], a new branch of the Ministry of Infrastructure. The INAC is engaged in a redrafting project to improve our aviation regulations (analogous to a 'Venezuelan FAR'). The MCCA will help fill the gap."
